

## MERCHANT MARINER CREDENTIALING PROCESS

The United States Coast Guard's (USCG) National Maritime Center (NMC) has a great website to guide you through the Credentialing process:

1. The first thing you will need to do is apply for a TWIC card:

- You will also need to have a current US passport. To apply for a passport go to the following website: https://pptform.state.gov/PassportWizardMain.aspx
- 3. You will also need to get a Physical Exam and have the Medical Practitioner complete the USCG form CG-719K:

- 4. A negative drug test result is also required: <u>https://www.dco.uscg.mil/Portals/9/NMC/pdfs/forms/CG\_719P.pdf</u>
- 5. You will also need to complete the minimum training requirements for the Merchant Mariner's Credential. Training is required as follows:

Basic Safety Training (BT) – 5 days, includes Basic Firefighting, First Aid & CPR, Personal Safety & Social Responsibilities, Personal Survival Techniques

Vessel Personnel with Designated Security Duties (VPDSD) – one day, includes Maritime Security Awareness

6. You will then need to apply for a Merchant Mariner's Credential (MMC) as an Ordinary Seaman, Wiper, Steward Department (FH), FH is "Food Handler". You will also need to apply for a STCW endorsement to be included in your MMC. <u>https://www.dco.uscg.mil/nmc/merchant\_mariner\_credential/</u>

7. For US military veterans, USCG-National Maritime Center may give you credit for your Military Sea Service for higher level ratings or officer endorsements. You must provide a Transcript of Sea Service, History of Assignments or acceptable military tracking software printout to the USCG for evaluation. The Sea Service must contain vessel information such as the name of each vessel or its official number, the period of time the you were assigned to each vessel, horsepower, tonnage, area of operation, rating for enlisted or rank for officers, and position held while assigned to a vessel.

8. The Seafarers International Union (SIU) represents all the unlicensed mariners aboard US Marine Management ships. Once you receive your MMC, the SIU will be able to assist you in joining the Union.
